## **Define Actions, Outcomes and Activities**

Goal 1	To enhance student learning outcomes across the school in all strands of Literacy and Numeracy.

Develop and implement a whole school approach to collect, analyse and use student data to improve teaching and learning.  4. Improve the way we implement the High Impact Teaching Strategies in classrooms across the school.
Outcomes	Leaders will:  1. Be able to clearly articulate what our instructional model is in Literacy and Numeracy.  2. Regularly observe lessons to monitor the implementation of the instructional models.  3. Support teachers to implement our instructional model in Literacy and Numeracy through coaching and feedback.  4. Regularly seek feedback from parents, students and teachers about our Literacy and Numeracy Model.  5. Provide collaborative time for teachers to analyse data.

Outcomes	Leaders will:  1. Monitor the implementation of learning goals across the school.  2. Regularly participate in student fortnightly reflection and goal setting sessions.  3. Promote academic excellence within the school community.  Teachers will:  1. Ensure students set SMART goals and regularly monitor and celebrate when they achieve their goals.  2. Support students to set and reflect on their learning goals by modelling and using worked examples.  3. Provide feedback to students on their SMART goals as part of our school wide fortnightly goals setting and reflection time.  4. Support students to be able to monitor their own learning by modelling and using worked examples.  5. Ensure that Student Portfolios are maintained to reflect student's performance.  Students will:  1. Set, monitor and reflected on personal SMART Goals across all areas of the curriculum.  2. Set, monitor and reflected on personal SMART Goals once a term for all specialist subjects.  3. Be able to monitor their own learning by knowing where they are on the continuum, what the next step in their learning is and what they need to do to achieve that.  4. Share their learning goals and achievements with their parents.  5. Reflect on and set new goals during Goal Setting and Reflection sessions.  6. Develop and maintain a Student Portfolio.  7. Deliver Student Led Conferences.  Parents will:  1. Be more aware of their child's progress through student led conferences, parent teacher interviews and showcases.  2. Attend student led conferences.
