#### Mr TAPP'S REPORT

Dear Somerville Families,

As the end of term 2 is almost here, I would like to thank the whole school community for their effort and support. It has been an extraordinary 12 weeks. Our students have done a superb job throughout the remote learning period, continuing their learning over many weeks in ways they have never had to do before. Very well done to our students.

Thank you to the parents and carers for the wonderful support of your children's learning over this period, thank you also for your support of the School. You have all been amazing. A big thank you to each and every one of our staff who have done an extraordinary job to ensure everything has gone to plan, it has been a wonderful team effort. All arrangements that we currently have in place due to COVID 19, including drop off and pick up, will remain in place for the commencement of Term 3 unless you are advised otherwise by the school. However we will be removing some of the temporary signage on the fences of the school. Please also be mindful that the staff carpark is not for parents to use between 8:00am and 4:30pm due to safety.

Over the last few weeks as we have had our students back on site, I have been very fortunate to meet with our Student Leaders and School Captains to discuss what makes Somerville such a great school. Sharing their insights and views from a student perspective was something I would like to share with the whole community. The sense of responsibility, community, pride and passion for each different area they lead was infectious. The leaders have also been working with teachers during planning week as they map out the curriculum for Term 3.

Class Teachers will be emailing the links for your timeslot early next week, we ask all parents to ensure they are on-time as the nature of the virtual conference means there is less flexibility if people are running late.

We understand that some parents have had many in-depth conversations about their children with classroom teachers during remote learning and as a result you may not feel you need to attend a Parent Teacher Interview on this occasion, please let the classroom teacher know if you do not require a Parent teacher interview this term.

#### Reports

This semester Reports will look different. The Department of Education (DET) have revised the format so that rather than your child receiving a progression point (dot), they will receive a more detailed comment providing an informative overview of their learning for Semester 1. Your child's report will be available on Sentral as a downloadable PDF on Monday at 4:00pm. It's a very simple process to access your child's report.

- Log into Sentral, access your child's 'Dashboard'
- Click Reporting, then Published reports, your child's report will be there ready to download.

# What are we doing to make our great school even better?

As a school we are continually working to develop our staff and refine teaching and learning approaches in different areas. Following our switch to Remote Learning in Term 2, we will be able to get our school improvement plans back on track in the second half of the year.

This work includes: continued implementation of our student literacy learning scope and sequence; strategies to develop deeper reading comprehension; close and regular monitoring of all students, including our high ability learners; and teacher coaching and observations by literacy and maths leaders.

At SPS Rebecca Mioduszewski our Learning Specialist heads up our Student Excellence Program, she works with a number of students providing extension programs to cater for the individual student needs. We will also be working on developing student agency throughout the school, with many of our students making great progress in this area during home learning in Term 2. In Term 4 we will be having our whole school review as part of the DET School Strategic Plan Cycle.

As part of the Review cycle, we will be working with and surveying School Council, parents and students about the school, reflecting on the last 4 years and planning our goals for the next 4 years. This is a very rewarding process. We will be sharing the success and feedback from the review panel.

School tours will recommence as soon as we are given permission by DET to proceed. We will contact anyone who has enquired as soon as we have more information. Our School Captains have been working on a virtual tour of our amazing school, which should have up on the website by the beginning of Term 3.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

## INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

#### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

DUCATIC

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.






**PARENTS:** Attendance is still important in a COVID-19 world. Please notify the school if your child is not able to complete their Remote Learning due to being unwell or any other reason.
